Dear parents/caregivers.

We have had a busy couple of weeks with Year 4's Special Assembly and Year 6 visiting the Unicorn Theatre.

Next week, Reception have their outing to the Discovery Centre in Stratford. A big thank you to all the parents who came to watch the assembly and those of you who have helped with the trips.

I also have some staffing changes to inform you about. I have appointed three interim Assistant Headteachers in Mr Fuiava's absence. 

Monday 3rd March


or support running the book sale on the morning of
