Anti-Bullying Week 2024

Anti-Bullying Week 2024 is happening from Tue 12th – Friday 15th November and has the theme 'Choose Respect.' It is coordinated by the Anti-Bullying Alliance, which is based at a leading children's charity—The National Children's Bureau.

Across the week, the children will be learning about the positive things that we can do to prevent bullying, how respecting others is a choice we make as well as who to speak to if they need to. We are asking that all children come to school on **Tue 12th** wearing blue in honour of Benedict house which represents the Christian value of **respect** as well as odd socks—these can be as outlandish as they wish them to be.

Children will take part in a whole school assembly for years 1-6 on Tues morning and complete a lesson in class as well as activities related to anti-bullying.

EYFS and KS1 Christmas Performances

We are delighted to invite our EYFS and Key Stage 1 parents to our Christmas performances, which will be held on **Wednesday 11th** and **Thursday 12th December** at **9 am**. To ensure all families have the opportunity to enjoy this event, we have designated specific days for different classes:

- For part-time nursery children, those who attend on **Wednesday afternoon Friday**, you are welcome to join us for the Wednesday morning performance between **9-10 am** if available. Please note, however, that due to our staffing ratios, these children will need to leave immediately after the performance.
- Each family will receive **two tickets** via their child for their performance day, allowing entry for two adults. Please remember to bring these tickets with you on the day, as they will be required for access to the hall.

Thank you for your cooperation in attending on the allocated day, which will help us accommodate all families comfortably. We look forward to celebrating this festive season with you and your children.

Uniform standards
