Anti-Bullying Week 2024

Odd socks | Benny Blue Blue Day - This year, the theme was 'Choose Respect'. There was an array of odd socks and blue attire being worn in school on Tuesday 12th to mark the beginning of 'Anti-bullying Week.' The message around the odd socks is to celebrate difference and each of us being unique and that this is a cause for celebration and not harm. This year we wore blue in honour of Benedict House whose Christian value is 'respect' The term "bullying" can be easily misused. Bullying is when there is an action by an individual or group against another individual Several Times On Purpose (think of STOP). Children may not get on or like each other and there may be one-off incidents of



unkindness, but this mustn't be confused with bullying. It is hard to prove that actions are intending to inflict harm with the youngest of children and so that is why education is so important, so children learn quickly the impact their actions may have. Children with autism, ADHD or other neurodiversities may act impulsively at times and not through deliberate unkindness and again, education plays a vital role here.











Football success

On Monday 11th November, nine children from year 4 and nine children from year 6 represented St Joan of Arc at a local football competition. The competition was fierce but the children displayed great resilience and sportsmanship. Well done to the children from year 4 who won nearly all of their games overall and were very positive during the tournament. Christmas jumper day

Book return plea

Over the past few years, we have invested thousands of pounds in high quality reading books to help support the children's love of reading. We want these books to be read and enjoyed and so we have always encouraged the children to take the books home. The vast majority are returned for other children to read. However, it is clear that we are missing lots of books from all across the school.

Every book we have is carefully chosen and comes with a price tag to match. This term alone, the school has had to spend over £2500 replacing books that have not

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been returned or have been damaged. We would therefore ask you to help us.

Please have a look at home and send any school books into school as soon a s possible. All St Joan of Arc books have a stamp on the inside cover or a colourful sticker on the back or the spine (see image). Some books could be from our Read Write Inc. phonics scheme or from the Oxford Reading Scheme and so will be easy to identify. However, most of our book corner books will look similar to the books you own at home so could have easily become mixed up with your own stocks.

If we want to continue allowing children to take these books home in future, we need as many as possible returned before the end of the term. Thank you in advance for your support,
